

USE:

RenThyroid™ (Thyroid Tablets, USP) is a prescription medication used to replace or supplement thyroid hormones in patients with hypothyroidism from any cause, except transient hypothyroidism during the recovery phase of subacute thyroiditis.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION:

THYROID HORMONE DRUGS, INCLUDING RENTHYROID, SHOULD NOT BE USED EITHER ALONE OR IN COMBINATION WITH OTHER DRUGS FOR THE TREATMENT OF OBESITY. IN PATIENTS WITH NORMAL THYROID FUNCTION, NORMAL DOSES FOR DAILY HORMONE REPLACEMENT ARE NOT EFFECTIVE FOR WEIGHT LOSS. LARGER DOSES MAY CAUSE SERIOUS OR EVEN LIFE-THREATENING EVENTS, ESPECIALLY WHEN USED IN COMBINATION WITH CERTAIN OTHER DRUGS USED TO REDUCE APPETITE.

- RenThyroid should not be used for male or female infertility unless this condition occurs with low thyroid levels.
- Do not use RenThyroid if you have uncorrected lack of adrenal hormones, high thyroid hormone levels, or allergies to any of the product ingredients.
- Taking too much RenThyroid may affect your cardiovascular system, especially if you are elderly or have heart problems. Tell your doctor immediately if you have any signs of chest pain, increased pulse, palpitations, excessive sweating, or any other unusual event.
- Tell your doctor about any other medical conditions you may have, especially heart disease, diabetes, blood clotting problems, and adrenal or pituitary gland problems. The dose of other drugs you may be taking for these conditions may have to be changed while you are taking RenThyroid. If you have diabetes, monitor your blood sugar levels and/or the glucose in your urine, and immediately tell your doctor if there are any changes.
- Tell your doctor about all of the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins and supplements. Especially tell your doctor if you take anticoagulants, diabetes drugs, oral contraceptives, or biotin.
- In infants, excessive doses of RenThyroid may cause a condition called craniosynostosis (premature closure of the skull bones).
- In children, partial hair loss may occur during the first few months of taking RenThyroid.

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


The Role of Thyroid Hormones in Your Body

The thyroid produces two key hormones



T4 (Thyroxine)

The primary hormone, which is converted into the active form, **T3**, in different parts of the body.



T3 (Triiodothyronine)

The hormone that actively affects metabolism, impacting how the body uses energy.

People with hypothyroidism produce less of these hormones, often requiring treatment to get blood levels in check. Millions of patients are on medications like Levothyroxine (a synthetic version of T4/thyroxine), which often bring their lab results into the normal range. **However, 10-15% of these patients report persistent symptoms.**

Treatment of hypothyroidism is more than just a matter of bloodwork — it's about **feeling better**. If you take **T4 monotherapy but still have symptoms**, it may be time to talk to your provider about RenThyroid.

RenThyroid is a **Natural Desiccated Thyroid (NDT)** that contains a fixed ratio of **T3 and T4 hormones** in one tablet, closely matching the natural hormone balance in the thyroid gland.

How to Take **RenThyroid**

Once you begin taking RenThyroid, it is important to **continue taking it as directed and follow your healthcare provider's advice**. They will monitor your progress and adjust your dose if needed. Keep in mind that it can take time for symptoms to improve.

Do not use RenThyroid if you have uncorrected lack of adrenal hormones, high thyroid hormone levels, or allergies to any of the product ingredients.



Important **Tips**

Notify Your Provider

Be sure to tell your provider about all of your medical conditions (especially heart disease, diabetes, blood clotting problems, and adrenal or pituitary gland problems) and if you start or stop any other medications while taking RenThyroid (especially anticoagulants, diabetes drugs, oral contraceptives, or biotin).

Monitor Your Symptoms

It may take a few weeks to notice improvement in your symptoms. Keep track of changes and report them to your provider.

Regular Monitoring

Regular blood tests are necessary to monitor your thyroid hormone levels and allow your provider to adjust your dose if needed.
